

# Magazine, Newspaper & Journal Articles

## Step 1 – Use an Electronic Resource to Find Articles on Your Topic

1. Go to the Library home page: <http://www.auctr.edu/>
2. Click on **Electronic Resources**.
3. Choose either **GALILEO** or **Databases**.

<b>GALILEO</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✦ Access over 150 electronic resources to find magazine, newspaper and journal articles <i>and more</i> on your topic.</li> <li>✦ Use your school's GALILEO password to access these resources from off-campus. (Pick up your password at the Library Reference Desk.)</li> </ul>
<b>Databases</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✦ Use nearly 50 additional electronic resources specifically chosen by Woodruff Librarians to complement GALILEO.</li> <li>✦ <i>Off-campus access to these resources will be implemented early 2005.</i></li> </ul>

4. Choose one of the databases.  
*A reference librarian can help you identify the databases that will have the information you need.*

<b>EBSCOhost Academic Search Premier</b> (GALILEO)	✦ Multi-subject database of magazine, newspaper and scholarly journal articles. [Full Text]
<b>Proquest Research Library</b> (GALILEO)	✦ Multi-subject database of magazine and scholarly journal articles. [Full Text]
<b>Proquest Newspapers</b> (GALILEO)	✦ Articles from major U.S. newspapers. [Full Text]

5. Be sure to print or copy the full citation for any articles that you use including the name of the magazine, newspaper or journal, volume number, issue number, date and pages.

6. Click on the link to HTML or PDF full text *if available* to view and print, e-mail or download your article. If the full text is not available in this database follow the remaining steps to locate your article.

## Step ② – Find the Full Text Article in Another Database

If you find the full text of your article above... great! These next steps will help you to locate articles that are *not* available full text in the database you have chosen.

1. Go to the Library home page: <http://www.auctr.edu/>
2. Click on **Electronic Resources**.
3. Choose **Electronic Journals**.
4. Enter a few distinctive words from the title of your magazine, newspaper or journal to **search**.
5. If your title appears and the database covers your year, follow the link to retrieve the full text article.

## Step ③ – Paper and Microform Articles

The Library subscribes to nearly 1400 magazines, newspapers and journals in print. Older issues for many titles are held in **bound volumes** or **microforms**.

**Where:** Periodical current issues and microforms are located in the southeast corner on the main level; bound volumes are located on bookshelves on the main level that begin in Periodicals and end at the Reference Collection by the front entrance.

To see if the Library has a paper or microfilm copy of your article, consult the **Library Catalog**.

1. Do an **Exact Search** by **Journal Title**.
2. View the full record to see the list of volumes and/or years held by the Library.

## Step ④ – Articles that the Library Does Not Own

If you need a book or journal that the Library does not own, we can help. Complete an **Interlibrary Loan Request Form** on the Library's Web site.

1. Go to the Library home page: <http://www.auctr.edu/>
2. Click on **Library Services >> Interlibrary Loan >> ILLiad Request Form**.
3. Be sure to fill in the form as completely as possible. Incomplete forms can delay your request.

Other libraries can generally send us materials for you in about one week, but it can take longer. Start your research early to be sure that you get all the articles and other items you need.
