## SCOPE NOTE

Trezzvant William Anderson (b. 1906 d. 1963) was an author and journalist best known for reporting on the injustices and inequalities of the Jim Crow South at the height of the Civil Rights Movement. For most of his career as a journalist, Anderson was affiliated with the *Pittsburgh Courier*, first as a desk reporter in Pittsburgh in 1947, and eventually as the “Courier Roving Reporter” traveling throughout the Southeastern United States. Anderson considered himself the voice of the people and often referred to himself as “your man” in his articles. His writings, as evidenced in this collection, concentrate mainly on civil rights issues such as boycotts, trials, and glaring examples of discrimination in the justice system. When Anderson was assigned to the *Courier’s* Circulation Department in 1958, he would frequently overlap his sales efforts with his reporting when travelling through the Southeast. Anderson would often trade publicity through articles to increase sales and his sales staff.

A member of the 761<sup>st</sup> Tank Battalion of the U.S. Army during World War II, Anderson wrote the unit’s history book *Come Out Fighting: The Epic Tale of the 761<sup>st</sup> Tank Battalion, 1942-1945*. A lifelong Elks member, Anderson was the editor of their magazine *Elkdom*. He was also a member of various organizations and unions such as the Washington Negro Press Club (serving as its president from 1931 to 1934), the American Newspaper Guild, and the American Federation of Labor.

This collection consists of the papers of Trezzvant W. Anderson from 1932 to 1963, with the bulk of it documenting the last few years of his life. It consists mainly of typescripts of his articles submitted in the latter part of his career as a reporter for the *Pittsburgh Courier*. Most of the articles were written under the bylines “Courier Press Service”, “Courier Roving Reporter”, “Dateline: Georgia”, and “Report from Dixie”. Also included in the collection are notebooks and printed materials Anderson used in writing and researching his articles. The earliest materials relate to his service in the U.S. Army during World War II, and his affiliation with the Elks. Very little of his family life is recorded in these papers. A few of the letters mention a wife in passing and he lists Eugenia M. Anderson as his wife on his 1952 tax return.

A significant amount of the correspondence is letters between Anderson and his managers at the *Pittsburgh Courier*. Of interest are the letters from William G. (Bill) Nunn, Executive Editor, and Managing Editor P.L. Prattis that concern story assignments and comments on his articles. Most of the correspondence dated 1958-1959 regards sales of the *Courier* and highlight the efforts of a Black newspaper to increase its circulation, especially in the segregated towns of the South. There is also correspondence that relates to his writings such as the letters asking Black community leaders in Florida to urge state officials to spare four men from the death penalty in a 1959 rape case, and letters from people he featured in his articles thanking him for the publicity. Of special interest is correspondence which documents civil rights efforts in the South: Attorney James Franklin Estes discusses Tennessee issues; Richard Haley, CORE field secretary, updates Anderson on the Huntsville, Alabama situation; and Robert W. Saunders writes about bus desegregation in Florida.

## TREZZVANT WILLIAM ANDERSON

### BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

- 1906 November 22 Born to Trezzvant E. and Amanda (Dixon) Anderson in Charlotte, NC
- 1924 Entered Johnson C. Smith University (did not graduate)
- 1927 October Appointed substitute railway mail clerk
- 1928 Became contributing editor at *The Charlotte Post*
- 1929-1930 Speech writer for Caesar R. Blake, Jr., Imperial Potentate of the Shriners
- 1930 Assigned regular railway mail clerk out of Washington, D.C.
- 1930 Founded the Washington Negro Press Club (served as its president from 1931 to 1934)
- 1931-1952 Publicist for J. Finley Wilson, Grand Exalted Ruler of the Elks
- 1941 November Fired as railway mail clerk
- 1943 January Drafted into the United States Army (served as Army correspondent and later became a member of the 761<sup>st</sup> Tank Battalion)
- 1944 October 22 Interviewed General George S. Patton at Nancy, France
- 1945 Published book *Come Out Fighting: The Epic Tale of the 761<sup>st</sup> Tank Battalion, 1942-1945*
- 1946 Published and edited his own newspaper in Charlotte, NC
- 1947 January Hired onto assembly line at Ford Motor Company in Detroit
- 1947 February Hired by *Pittsburgh Courier* as a journalist based in Pittsburgh
- 1957 Moved to the Southeast as the “Courier Roving Reporter”
- 1963 March 25 Died in Macon, Ga.

## SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

### **Series A                   About Trezzvant Anderson**

Box 1                   This series includes materials about Anderson including business cards, membership cards, and press passes. There are two flyers advertising Anderson as the *Pittsburgh Courier's* Roving Reporter and as author of *He Built an Empire: The Life Story of J. Finley Wilson*. There are newsclippings about Anderson and newsclippings of articles he wrote. (For additional writings by Anderson see Series H, boxes 7-16. Also in Series H is a "Complete Biography of Trezzvant Anderson," box 12, folder 10.)

### **Series B                   Military Service**

Box 1                   This small series contains a few papers related to Anderson's service in the U.S. Army. The folder of "Commendations and Orders" contains his orders to England, two separate commendations from officers of the 761<sup>st</sup> Tank Battalion, and an advertisement for writings from Brigadier General Plank. The "Notes on the Cuff" and "Vital Statistics" are his own writings, the former being a typed manuscript and the latter being handwritten notes and statistics kept in diary format. The *Waltmaxal Number 24* is a newsletter containing updates and anecdotes from servicemen. (See also the correspondence related to the 761<sup>st</sup> Tank Battalion Association in box 5 and Series K. Artifacts and Oversize Items for photographs and convention ribbons from the 761<sup>st</sup> Tank Battalion's second and third reunions.)

### **Series C                   Elks**

Box 1                   This series contains documents related to the Elks fraternal order. The news releases, reports, and speeches are typed manuscripts, a few written by Anderson. The published minutes for the 1954 annual meeting have been annotated by him. (See also the correspondence series for letters to and from Anderson regarding the Elks .)

### **Series D                   Financial Records**

Box 1                   These are the records of Anderson's personal finances and include pay stubs, receipts, and bank account statements. Also filed here are insurance records and a few of his income tax returns and statements.

### **Series E                   Legal Documents**

Box 1                      These few documents relate to legal cases Anderson featured in his writings. He especially liked to report on court cases that exposed the hypocrisies and injustices of segregation. The two affidavits are eyewitness accounts of voter registration discrimination in Brownville, Tennessee. The Alexander file is a well-argued plea from a Black student's parents to the Charlotte school board for an equal education opportunity for their son. School desegregation is the subject of the Nelson case which highlights the Birmingham court's procrastination on the issue. Alabama is also the setting for the Coleman v. Barton and Woods v. State cases of jury service discrimination and a bus boycott, respectively.

**Series F                      Correspondence**

Boxes 2-6                      This correspondence, spanning the years 1932 to 1963, documents Anderson's personal and professional lives. Much of the correspondence is between Anderson and the *Pittsburgh Courier* staff. William G. (Bill) Nunn, Executive Editor, and Editor P.L. Prattis wrote to him about his assignments and articles. The letters to Sylvestre Watkins, Circulation Director, and from Esther Moore, Collections Manager, regard Anderson's sales force and their efforts to increase circulation. Anderson's personal letters are mainly from friends and fellow Elks. Letters from Anderson's girlfriends have restricted access. The earliest correspondence refers to the publication of his book *Come Out Fighting*. The letters from government agencies usually regard Anderson's job enquiries. This series is arranged alphabetically by the name of the correspondent. Generally, if a letter was written by someone acting as an organization's representative, it has been filed under the organization's name. Although the majority of the *Pittsburgh Courier* letters are filed under the organization's name, many of the other letters are also related to Anderson's work with the *Courier*.

**Series G                      Pittsburgh Courier**

Box 7                      The bulk of the materials in this series are related to Anderson's job with the *Courier* Circulation Department. The forms, manuals, and lists document his efforts to recruit salesmen and increase circulation. Also included in this series are company newsletters, "Courier Correspondence", and a publicity brochure, "The Pittsburgh Courier Story" by William G. Nunn, Sr. (See also Series F. Correspondence and Series H. Writings by Trezzvant Anderson.)

## Series H

### Writings by Trezzvant Anderson

Boxes 7-16

This series contains carbon copies of articles Anderson wrote when he was a reporter for the *Pittsburgh Courier*. He used four bylines: “Courier Press Service”, “Courier Roving Reporter”, “Dateline: Georgia”, and “Report from Dixie”. Quite frequently the different bylines shared the same subject matter, especially those concerning political or legal issues. His writings under “Courier Press Service” and “Courier Roving Reporter” are for both the national and the Georgia editions of the *Courier*. His “Dateline: Georgia” articles were written in a “gossip column” style and usually featured profiles on prominent Georgians and social events, in addition to news stories. The 12 articles under the byline “Report from Dixie” were written at the end of his career and are similar to an editorial in style. The articles found in the “Pittsburgh Courier” subseries do not have a header from one of his four usual bylines, but are clearly written for the *Courier*. “Other Writings” contains a few essays not written for the *Courier*, as well as notepads of his notes written when researching news stories.

Titles in quotation marks are the titles written by Anderson. Titles not in quotation marks have been created by the archivist, in the absence of Anderson’s titles, and succinctly reflect the content of the article. If more than one article appears on a page, the titles in the folder list are separated by a “//” symbol. Most of the writings are undated unless otherwise noted. (NB: Fragile items have been photocopied as a preservation measure. The photocopy is for research use. The originals are restricted and are located separately in boxes 25-28).

## Series I

### Printed Materials

Boxes 17-18

This series contains newsletters, programs, reports, and ephemera, much of which Anderson most likely used as background research in writing articles. Of special interest are the two reports on school desegregation by the Southern Regional Council.

**Series J                      Photographs**

Boxes 19-20                      The bulk of this series is black and white snapshots, seemingly taken by Anderson to document his articles. They are mainly of people and locations in Georgia for the years 1958 to 1962. The folders contain both the photographs and the negatives as they were found together in the original photostop envelopes.

**Series K                      Artifacts and Oversize Items**

Boxes 21-22  
Item 23                      This series includes Trezzvant Anderson's smoking pipe, a leather wallet, business card holder, rubber stamps for "Report from Dixie" and his Charlotte mailing address, an engraving stamp of Anderson's signature, and convention ribbons from Elks meetings, AFL Labor Conference, and 761<sup>st</sup> Tank Battalion Third Annual Reunion. The oversize items include an original copy of "The Atlanta Story," *Pittsburgh Courier*, July 15, 1961. This 28 page story was written by Trezzvant Anderson. There are also three oversize photographs of the NAPE 1951 Biennial Convention, and the second and third reunions of the 761 Tank Battalion.

**Series L                      Audiotapes [Temporarily Restricted until a research copy can be made]**

Box 24                      There are two recordings of Anderson's *Pittsburgh Courier* column "Report from Dixie."

Boxes 25-28                      These boxes include the original fragile items that were among the collection. Most of these items are from Series H. Writings by Trezzvant Anderson. Photocopies of these items have been interfiled within the collection for research use. The original items have been restricted as a preservation measure.
